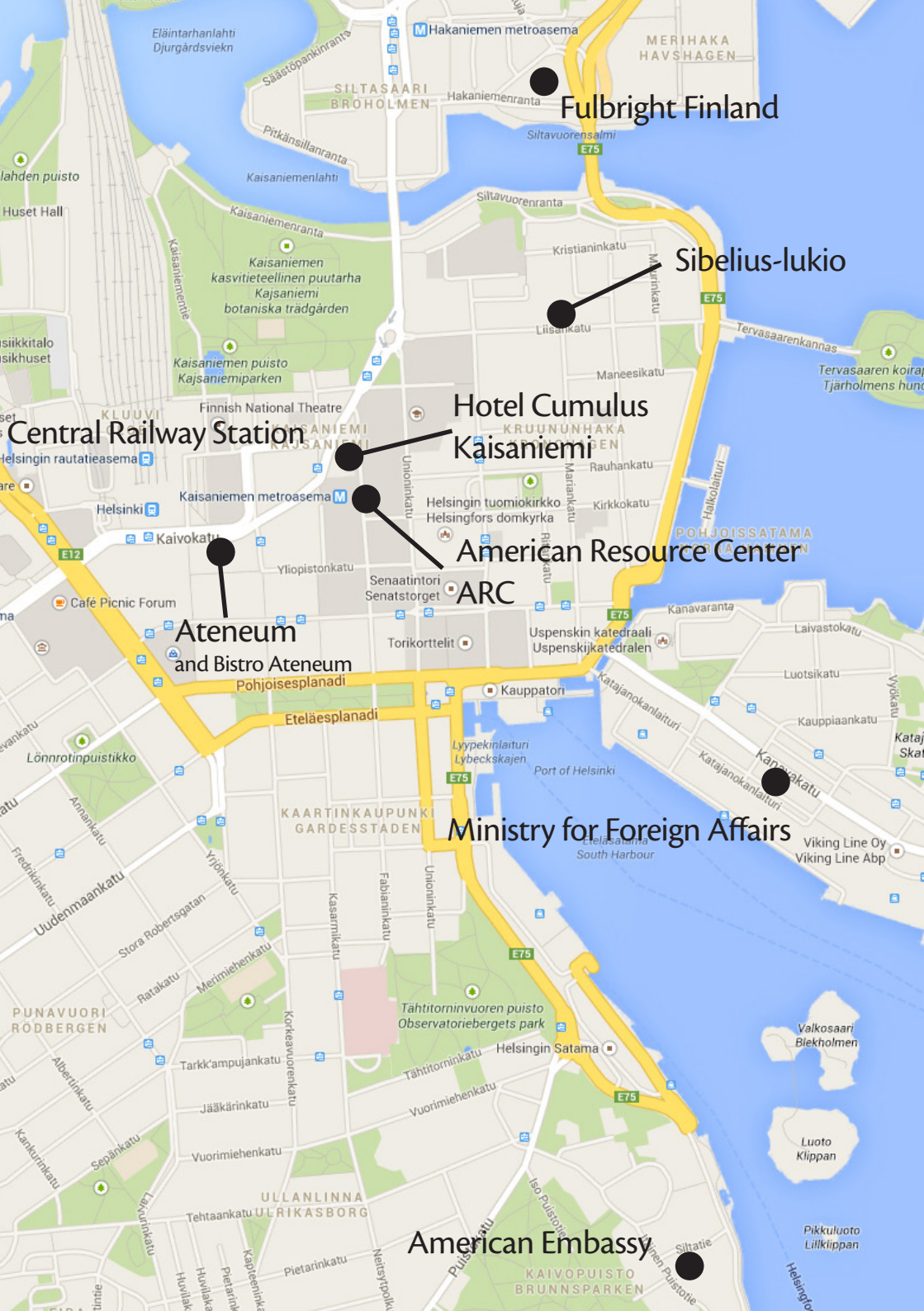

Joakim Frände is a Tax and Legal Manager at KPMG, he holds a Doctor of Laws degree from the University of Helsinki. Frände specializes in the domestic and international taxation of individuals. Prior to taking up employment at KPMG in early 2017, Joakim has worked as a lecturer in public law at Faculty of Law at the University of Helsinki.



Petteri Granat teaches history, social studies, and philosophy at Vaskivuori Upper Secondary School in Vantaa, Finland. He received a Fulbright Distinguished Award in Teaching grant in 2014. He is also an expert in Finnish craft beer.



Ilkka Haavisto is Research Manager at Finnish Business and Policy Forum EVA. He has worked with a wide range of economic and social issues including public sector reform, taxation, labour market and the EU. He graduated from Åbo Akademi University (economics and philosophy) in 2000.



Sophia Hagolani-Albov is a doctoral student at the University of Helsinki in the Department of Agriculture and Forestry in the Agroecology group. She is social scientist and her research examines sustainability transformation in the agricultural sector and the process of place making in the Finnish countryside. Sophia is also an alumna of the Fulbright program and did her research in 2013-2014.



Ph.D. Johanna Hakala is the Manager of International Affairs at the Academy of Finland and alumna of the Fulbright mid-career professional development (MCPD) program. She is responsible for the overall coordination of the Academy's activities supporting international research collaboration and mobility. She has previously worked in university research administration and as a researcher in the field of science studies.



Veera Heinonen is the Director of Communications and Public Affairs at The Finnish Innovation Fund Sitra. She has extensive experience in the world of media. She worked as a Spokesperson for the President of the Republic and as a Press Counsellor and Director of Communication at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs.



Erja Heikkinen is a senior expert in the Science policy division of the Finnish Ministry of Education and Culture with an emphasis in the development of the Finnish research and innovation system in collaboration with stakeholders. Her responsibilities include enhancing utilisation of competences produced in higher education institutions, researcher training, careers in research, and structural development of the higher education institution.



Taina Iduozee is Information Resource Center Director at the American Resource Center. Ph.D. (Econ.), Adjunct professor Teemu Kokko is the President at Haaga-Helia University of Applied Sciences in Helsinki, Finland. During his career he has lived and worked abroad a total of nine years (Moscow, Budapest and Oslo) and he is deeply involved in numerous international activities. He is an ad hoc columnist for two Finnish hospitality-industry magazines.



Timo Korkeamäki is the Dean of Research and the Pentti Professor of Finance at the Hanken School of Economics in Helsinki. He received his PhD in 2001 from University of South Carolina. Prior to joining Hanken in 2008, he taught at Gonzaga University in Spokane, WA for seven years.



Johanna Kotkajärvi is the Director of the Unit for Communications on Asia, Africa and the Americas at the Finnish Ministry for Foreign Affairs. Her previous foreign postings include the Embassies of Finland in Oslo, Zagreb and Luxembourg. She has a Master's degree in Political Science from the University of Helsinki.



Jouni Mölsä has been the Director General of Communications for the Ministry for Foreign Affairs since 2012. He previously worked for different companies in Finland and abroad and has extensive experience in the media and communications industry. He is currently the Chair of the Finland-America Educational Trust Fund.



Elisa Repo is a doctoral student in applied linguistics and sociolinguistics at the Johannes Gutenberg University of Mainz, Germany, and a language and culture awareness teacher at the Faculty of Education, University of Turku. She has been a visiting research fellow at the Finnish Institute in Germany, taught Finnish as a second language, worked as a visiting scholar at the University of Hamburg, Germany, and as a Fulbright FLTA at Indiana University, Bloomington, IN, USA.



Donna Welton took up her post as Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Helsinki in August 2016 following a detail to the Department of Defense as the acting Director for Southeast Asia in the Office of the Secretary of Defense (Policy). She began her career with the United States Information Agency in 1984 and did three tours in Asian posts. She completed her coursework for a PhD in Princeton's Asian Art and Archaeology Department.



Jeremy Wisemiller is the Consul at U.S. Embassy Helsinki. He arrived in Finland in June 2017 following a two year consular assignment at U.S. Embassy Nairobi. Joining the Foreign Service in 2010, his first overseas tour was in Prague, Czech Republic, where he served as the American Citizen Services Chief.
