

Provided by a U.S. program partner **for degree students** particularly

- Review application materials
- Cover university application costs, incl. application fees, required test fees, and credential evaluations

HOW TO SELECT A SUITABLE UNIVERSITY?

1. Start with you

- What will you do after your Fulbright?
- Personal goals and future career plans

2. Academic qualities

- Degree, major, program structure & type, course selection
- Faculty supervisor/mentor WHO DO YOU WANT TO WORK WITH?
- Research focus RIGHT FIT/MATCH FOR YOU!
- Access to research material, facilities
- Institutional type and size (e.g. Carnegie Classification)
- Accreditation
- Non-degree options?



HOW TO SELECT A SUITABLE UNIVERSITY?

- 3. University Placement Service
- 4. University costs and funding + cost of living
 - Recommended amount for living costs
 - > USD 2 800 to 4 300 per month
- 5. Name recognition/ranking?







BALANCED APPLICATION PLAN

- Narrow down your prospective schools
- Apply to 4-8 universities
 - Master's students to at least 4
 - Doctoral students to at least 5
- Include safer options

GRADUATE ADMISSION

The complete application typically includes:

- Application
- Transcripts and diplomas
- Application essay (personal/research statement)
- Recommendations
- Test scores (GRE, GMAT, TOEFL)
- Medical documents
- Funding plan (if needed)
- Portfolio or other field specific materials
- Application fees
 - not for Fulbrighters using the Placement Service

GMAT

Analytical Writing Assessment—measures your ability to think critically and to communicate your ideas

Integrated Reasoning—measures your ability to analyze data and evaluate information presented in multiple formats

Quantitative Reasoning—measures your ability to analyze data and draw conclusions using reasoning skills

Verbal Reasoning—measures your ability to read and understand written material, to evaluate arguments and to correct written material to conform to standard written English


