

# Orientation Speakers

In addition to the Fulbright Finland team and alumni experts, we are pleased to include the following speakers in the 2018 orientation program for the U.S. grantees.



Robert Frank Pence is the U.S. Ambassador to the Republic of Finland. Previously, he served as the founder and Chairman of the Board of the Pence Group, a full-service development company. He was also active as a board member of the Gary Sinise Foundation and served on the boards of the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, the Wolf Trap Foundation, the World Affairs Council, George Mason University, and American University. He is Honorary Chair of the Fulbright Finland Foundation Board of Directors.



T.J. Grubisha is the Counsellor for Public Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Helsinki and has worked in the U.S. Foreign Service since 1998. Prior to being assigned to Finland, T.J. was Senior Advisor for Press and New Media at the U.S. Diplomacy Center, the State Department's museum and education center. He is also a member of the Fulbright Finland Foundation Board of Directors.



Ilkka Haavisto is Research Manager at Finnish Business and Policy Forum EVA. He has worked with a wide range of economic and social issues including public sector reform, taxation, labour market and the EU. He graduated from Åbo Akademi University (economics and philosophy) in 2000.



Sophia Hagolani-Albov is a doctoral student at the University of Helsinki in the Department of Agriculture and Forestry in the Agroecology group. As a social scientist, her research examines sustainability transformation in the agricultural sector and the process of place making in the Finnish countryside. Sophia is also an alumna of the Fulbright program and did her research in 2013-2014.



Ph.D. Johanna Hakala is the Manager of International Affairs at the Academy of Finland and alumna of the Fulbright mid-career professional development (MCPD) program. She is responsible for the overall coordination of the Academy's activities supporting international research collaboration and mobility. She has previously worked in university research administration and as a researcher in the field of science studies.



Dr. Erja Heikkinen has been with the Ministry of Education and Culture in Finland since 2005. Her tasks consist of national and international science policy responsibilities. An essential part of her work takes place in national and multinational networks. Dr. Heikkinen is heading the Science Policy Division of the Department of Higher Education and Science Policy.



Veera Heinonen is the Director of Communications and Public Affairs at The Finnish Innovation Fund Sitra. She has extensive experience in the world of media. She worked as a Spokesperson for the President of the Republic and as a Press Counsellor and Director of Communication at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs.



Birger Holm currently works as a Vice Principal, History and Civics Teacher at Haukilahti School in Espoo. He is the U.S. State Department's Voluntary Visitor Program alumnus and has promoted interdisciplinary studies in Finland by inspiring English teachers to introduce more U.S. History content in English classes.



Taina Iduozee has been the American Resource Center Director at the U.S. Embassy Helsinki since 2007. Prior to this position, Taina worked for over 15 years in research and public libraries. She has a Master's degree in Literary Studies from the University of Tampere.



Ph.D. (Econ.), Adjunct professor Teemu Kokko is the President at Haaga-Helia University of Applied Sciences in Helsinki, Finland. During his career he has lived and worked abroad a total of nine years (Moscow, Budapest and Oslo) and he is deeply involved in numerous international activities. He is an ad hoc columnist for two Finnish hospitality-industry magazines.



Timo Korkeamäki is the Dean of Research and the Pentti Professor of Finance at the Hanken School of Economics in Helsinki. He received his PhD in 2001 from University of South Carolina. Prior to joining Hanken in 2008, he taught at Gonzaga University in Spokane, WA for seven years. Timo is a member of the Fulbright Finland Foundation Board of Directors



Janne Korkka is a senior lecturer at the English Department of University of Turku specializing in Canadian Literature. He coordinates the university's North American Studies Program and organizes the American Voices Seminar in co-operation with the Fulbright Finland Foundation.



Eevamari Laaksonen is the Director of the Unit for Communications on Asia, Africa and the Americas at the Finnish Ministry for Foreign Affairs. She is a Finnish diplomat with a long experience of working in the Foreign Service. Before her current position she worked as a Deputy Director of the Unit for Russia.



Jouni Mölsä has been the Director General of Communications for the Ministry for Foreign Affairs since 2012. He previously worked for different companies in Finland and abroad and has extensive experience in the media and communications industry. He is currently the Chair of the Finland-America Educational Trust Fund.



Elisa Repo is a doctoral student in applied linguistics at the Johannes Gutenberg University of Mainz and at the University of Turku. Currently she is working as a teacher for linguistically and culturally responsive teaching at the Department of Teacher Education at the University of Turku. He holds a Master of Science in Economics from Hanken Business School in Helsinki.



Jeremy Wisemiller is the Consul at U.S. Embassy Helsinki. He arrived in Finland in June 2017 following a two year consular assignment at U.S. Embassy Nairobi. Joining the Foreign Service in 2010, his first overseas tour was in Prague, Czech Republic, where he served as the American Citizen Services Chief. He has also served in Islamabad and Washington, D.C.



David Yoken is a Senior Lecturer at the Arts Academy of the Turku University of Applied Sciences.
