### **FULBRIGHT CENTER**

The Fulbright Center specializes in cultural exchange between Finland and North America. It awards grants for academic exchanges between Finland and the United States, advises on study and research opportunities in the United States and Canada.

The Fulbright Center is a non-profit organization funded by the Finnish Ministry of Education, the American and Canadian governments, and a Trust Fund founded by the Finnish and U.S. governments. The Fulbright Center is governed by an eight-member Board of Directors, with equal Finnish and American representation. The Finnish members are appointed by the Finnish Ministry of Education and the U.S. members by the American Embassy in Finland. The U.S. Ambassador to Finland serves as the Honorary Chairperson of the Board.

The Fulbright Center awards grants to close to 90 Finnish and American students, academics, and professionals annually. This year, 27 Americans have received a Fulbright grant to lecture, conduct research, study, or teach in Finland. In addition, the Center expects to award approximately 10 short-term grants during the academic year.
