Dress Code

The orientation program contains a substantial amount of walking, so comfortable shoes are recommended. Please let us know in advance if this is a concern to you.

The dress code for the first orientation day is casual. We are heading to have sauna after our introductions at the Fulbright Finland Foundation office, so we recommend bringing comfortable and warm clothes to wear afterwards.

For the second day the dress code is business as we will be attending an Alumni Reception at the U.S. Embassy. Please note that we head straight to the U.S. Embassy after the City Tour. Changing into your reception attire will not be possible, so come dressed for the day.

On Friday we will spend the day at EMMA Espoo Museum of Modern Art and Sibelius Upper Secondary School. For this day the dress code is business casual.

Wifi

Fulbright Finland Foundation office building and Villa Hvittorp have a Wi-Fi connection for visitors.

Accommodation

Hotel Scandic Hakaniemi is located in the Hakaniemi part of Helsinki, a few minute walk from the Fulbright Finland Foundation office. Check in starts at 3 pm, but luggage can be left at the hotel earlier. The reception desk is open 24/7 so you can check in at any time after 3 pm. If you are staying additional nights at your own expense, please make sure you pay any out-of-pocket costs during check-in. Please note that on the day of your departure, you should remove your luggage from your room by 12 pm. You may leave your carry-ons at the luggage hold at the hotel.

Breakfast is served during the week at 6:30-10:00 am.

Arrival

<u>From the Central Railway Station</u> you can take the following public transportation methods to get to the hotel. Metro and tram (*ratikka*) leave from the railway station. Metro station is located underground, and the tram station is in front of the Railway Station.

You can take any of the following trams. Get off at Hakaniemi stop.

- Tram number 3 towards Meilahti
- Tram number 6, 6T towards Arabia
- Tram number 9 towards Pasila



If you prefer walking, the hotel is about 1,5 km (0.93 miles) from the railway station.

<u>From Kamppi</u>, the main bus station, you can take the following public transportation methods to get to the hotel. Get off at Hakaniemi stop.

- Tram number 9 towards Pasila. Get on at Simonkatu.
- Subway (metro) towards Vuosaari or Mellunmäki.

Buy a ticket before getting on or you might be fined 80€ for traveling without a ticket. You can buy a single ticket in advance from any R-Kioski, ticket machines, or download the HSL (Helsinki public transport) app. The ticket inside the Helsinki city center will be for zones AB, and the ticket costs 2,80€. Please note that R-Kioski adds a small service fee for each ticket when purchased from there.

Tickets are not sold on trams or metros. They are sold on buses, and a ticket for the AB-zone costs 4€ (cash only!) Please note that these public transportation tickets inside Helsinki are **not reimbursed**.

The third orientation day ends at 3.30 pm. We recommend reserving tickets back to your Finnish home town earliest after 4.30 pm. You will need time to go back to the hotel to collect your luggage as there is no possibility to have it with you during the orientation day.

Wednesday, January 22

The orientation starts at the Fulbright Finland Foundation office at Hakaniemenranta 6. Fulbright Finland Foundation team members will meet you at the hotel lobby to escort you to the office at 12:10.

If you wish to arrive to Hakaniemenranta 6 on your own, please be at the lobby by 12:25.

After the Orientation sessions at the Fulbright Finland Foundation office, we will travel by bus to Villa Hvittorp in Kirkkonummi. The teachers' and scholars' breakout sessions with invited Fulbright program alumni and other discussion leaders will take place at the historical Villa Hvittorp. The evening continues with sauna and possibility to swim in Lake Vitträsk and concludes with a dinner. Please remember to take with you your bathing suit, towel and other necessities for sauna in the morning. If you plan on going ice swimming, we recommend also taking slippers with you. You will not have time to get your things from the hotel during the orientation day.

If your family members are joining us at Hvittorp but not the sessions at the office, please note that family members should be at the Hakaniemenranta 6 lobby by 15:20.

Family members can go to sauna earlier (at 4:30 pm), enjoy some Finnish winter activities in the yard, or stay cozy at the Villa Hvittorp playing cards etc.

Remember that you are not allowed to take any: large bags, memory sticks, computers, Bluetooth headphones and cameras past the embassy security, so travel light that day.

While in the Embassy, your phone's Bluetooth and Wi-Fi must be turned off.

Getting Back to the Hotel

Our program will end at approximately 3:30 pm. From the Sibelius Upper Secondary School it is a 1,2 km (0.7 miles) walk to the Hotel Scandic Hakaniemi. - Bus 61 towards Siltamäki from Kaisaniemenpuisto stop
- Bus 77 towards Jakomäki from Kaisaniemenpuisto stop


We recommend you purchase your travel ticket back to your city the earliest at 4:30 pm. This way you will have enough time to stop by the hotel and make it to your bus or train.

Please note that reimbursements are paid immediately after February 3, so please ensure that all questions are handled by that date. Please also note that you are required to participate in the whole orientation program in order to be reimbursed.

Teachers, who don't have a Finnish bank account, will be reimbursed in one lump sum during summer 2020. Please note that you are still required to send your original travel tickets by February 3.
